

ST. LOUIS COUNTY DWI COURT OVERVIEW

Quadrant I – High Risk/High Need

Phase 1 - Acute Stabilization (minimum of 60 days)

- Attend Court weekly
- Weekly report with probation officer
- Comply with supervision and be honest
- Begin SROP treatment – group/individual sessions as determined by assessment
- Medication Assisted Treatment as determined by assessment, monitoring of prescribed medications
- SCRAM device for a minimum of 30 days.
- Develop case plan to address needs – housing, employment
- Monthly home visits
- Random drug/alcohol testing
- Obtain medical/mental health assessment if needed
- Begin community support group meetings as directed– verify attendance
- Begin to work on changing people, places, and things
- Pay \$50.00 per month for DWI court fees

Treatment: Level 2 – Out-patient treatment, which consists of group and individual sessions. Morning and evening hours are available.

In order to advance: engage with treatment; comply with supervision; be honest; minimum sobriety time of 14 consecutive days; sanction free 30 days prior to promotion to the next phase.

**The requirements of any phase may be increased based upon progress in the program.*

Phase 2 - Clinical Stabilization (minimum of 90 days)

- Attend Court every two weeks.
- Weekly report with probation officer
- Continue SROP treatment, begin Criminal Thinking program (MRT or HEAT)
- Comply with supervision and be honest
- Review and update case plan based on need
- Monthly home visits
- Random drug/alcohol testing
- Continue community support groups, verify attendance – minimum of two per week
- Obtain a community support group sponsor
- Full time employment/school or combination of the two
- Address medical/dental needs
- Complete 25 hours of community service
- Demonstrate changing of people, places, and things
- Pay \$50.00 per month for DWI court fees

Quadrant I – High Risk/High Need

In order to advance: engage with treatment; comply with supervision; be honest; full time employment; minimum sobriety time of 30 consecutive days; sanction free 30 days prior to promotion to the next phase.

Phase 3 - Pro-Social Habilitation (minimum of 90 days)

- Attend court monthly
- Report twice a month to probation officer
- Remain engaged with treatment
- Comply with supervision and be honest
- Review and update case plan based on need
- Monthly home visits
- Random drug/alcohol testing
- Maintain community support recovery groups
- Establish recovery network
- Attend VIP panel and complete a reflection paper
- Establish pro-social activity
- Full time employment/school or a combination of the two
- Complete 25 hours of community service
- Demonstrate changing people, places, and things
- Pay \$50.00 per month for DWI court fees

In order to advance: engage with treatment; comply with supervision; be honest; be involved in pro-social activities and with recovery network; verified completion of VIP and paper; minimum sobriety time of 45 consecutive days; no sanctions 30 days prior to promotion to the next phase.

Phase 4 - Adaptive Habilitation (minimum of 90 days)

- Attend court monthly
- Report twice a month to probation officer
- Remain engaged with treatment
- Continue criminal thinking program
- Comply with supervision and be honest
- Review and update case plan based on need
- Monthly home visits
- Random drug/alcohol testing
- Maintain community support groups
- Maintain pro-social activity
- Complete 25 hours of community service
- Full time employment/school or combination of the two
- Demonstrate changing of people, places, and things
- Pay \$50.00 per month for DWI court fees

Quadrant I – High Risk/High Need

In order to advance: engage with treatment; comply with supervision; be honest; engage with pro-social activities and recovery network; minimum sobriety time of 60 consecutive days; no sanctions 30 days prior to promotion to the next phase.

Phase 5 - Continuing Care (minimum of 90 days)

- Attend Court monthly
- Report to probation officer monthly
- Remain engaged with treatment
- Complete criminal thinking program
- Develop continuing care and relapse prevention plan
- Comply with supervision and be honest
- Review case plan
- Monthly home visits
- Random drug/alcohol testing
- Maintain peer recovery network
- Maintain pro-social activity
- Full time employment/school or combination of the two
- Complete 25 hours of community service
- Demonstrate changing people, places, and things
- Pay \$50.00 per month for DWI court fees

In order to graduate: complete treatment; minimum sobriety time of 120 consecutive days; no sanctions 60 days prior to graduation; pay all program fees and submit application for graduation 30 days prior to the date of expected graduation.

- **Participants are not permitted to use of any type of illicit substances or alcoholic beverages while participating in the DWI court program.**
- **Participants are not permitted to frequent any premises, bars, or gambling establishment where the primary item for sale is alcohol.**

Continued violations or willful failure to comply with any item within any phases may result in a sanction being imposed and may result in termination from Alternative Court or revocation of probation, if it applies. Rewards, Therapeutic Adjustments, and sanction will include, but are not limited to the following:

Rewards:

1. Positive re-enforcement from the Judge and DWI Court Team;
2. Credit toward court costs or ACS balance;
3. Excused from court appearance or advanced to 1st in line;
4. Coupons or gift certificates;
5. Case dismissed or early termination from probation.
